1 - Turn on the dishwasher using the On/Off button.








2 - The default setting will be P3 – ‘Eco Mode ‘ which will be suitable for most cases.

3 - If you are only running a half load, press the load button.



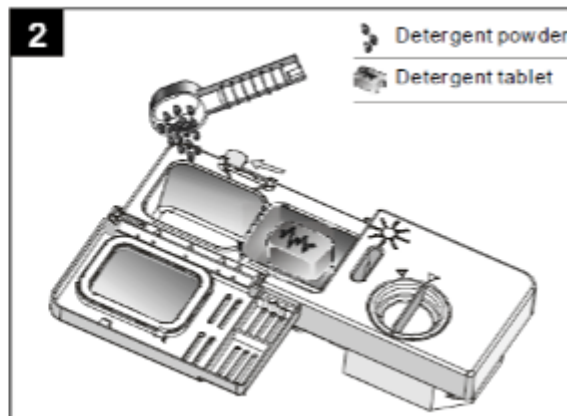
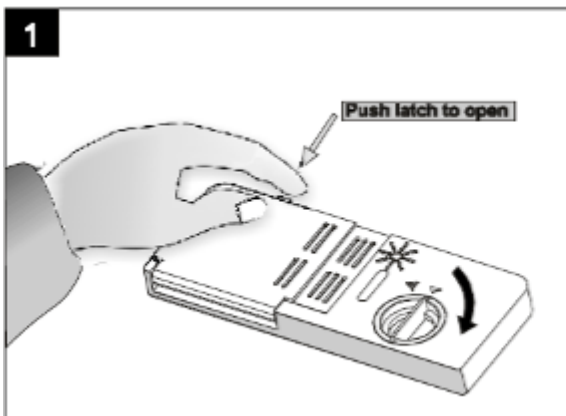
4 - To change the program, press the program button.

Programs are as follows:

6 - The display panel will show information to you

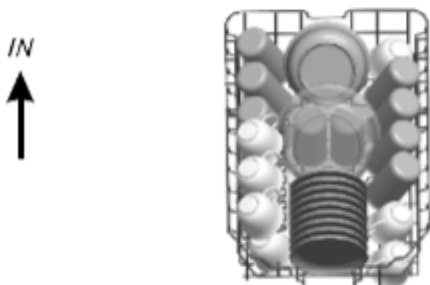
Display screen: to show the error code, delay time etc.

- Rinse Aid indicator: ✱
Indicates when the dispenser needs to be refilled.
- Add salt indicator: Ⓢ
Indicates when the dispenser needs to be refilled.
- Delay time, Program indicators or error codes indicator: 88
- Half load functions indicator: 1/2
- Infall Warning Light : ⚡
Being on When faucets is not opened.

7 - Follow the loading instructions.

Loading the Upper Basket

The upper basket is designed to hold more delicate and lighter dishware such as glasses, coffee and tea cups and saucers, as well as plates, small bowls and shallow pans (as long as they are not too dirty). Position the dishes and cookware so that they will not get moved by the spray of water.



Please be reminded that:

- Pots, serving bowls, etc, must always be placed top down.
- Deep pots should be slanted to allow water to flow out.
- The Bottom Basket features folding spikes so that larger or more pots and pans can be loaded.

Loading the Lower Basket

We suggest that you place large items and the most difficult to clean items are to be placed into the lower basket: such as pots, pans, lids, serving dishes and bowls, as shown in the figure below. It is preferable to place serving dishes and lids on the side of the racks in order to avoid blocking the rotation of the top spray arm.



Ensure any sharp items such as knives are loaded into the cutlery basket pointing down to avoid injury.

8 - Close the door and wait for the cycle to start.

9 - Do not open the door while the cycle is in process.

10 - Once the cycle has finished the machine buzzer will sound for 8 seconds. Open the door carefully and press the On/Off button. Leave the door ajar and wait a few minutes before removing the items from the dishwasher, this will give them a chance to cool.
